REPORT OF THE VOLUNTEER CHAIR AND CEO

Looking back over the past year and how challenging it was, there are many ways to describe how we got to "extraordinary." First, our donor community enabled Royal University Hospital (RUH) Foundation to raise \$11.3 million. We are incredibly grateful to each one of you for stepping forward during this challenging time, a time when lights shone brightly on the importance of our health-care system. From the moment the pandemic began, every aspect of care at RUH changed. We continue to see what RUH's extraordinary teams do every day and we remain proud to work alongside them to engage donors to accelerate health care now and into the future. We would not be able to do what we do without the dedication and support from donors and our volunteers – so thank uou!

We realized early on that COVID-19 would put incredible stress on the health-care system and that extra support was needed to ensure optimal care for the people in our community. On April 2, we were proud to collaborate with our sister foundations in Saskatoon, to launch the COVID-19 Hospital Fund to



support unmet priorities and efforts at our four hospitals.

Like you, we had to pivot quickly in April. Our extraordinary staff came together while working remotely to adjust engagement efforts, check in with donors, and redesign communication materials and events - all while going virtual. Our three virtual Women Leading Philanthropy (WLP) sessions presented to women donors included virtual voting for a \$100,000 WLP Grant; we delivered a virtual radiothon across Saskatchewan on January 28 and 29 at which time we officially launched the Mission Possible: Operation New O.R. Campaign raising \$421,585 for the transformation of the 43-year-old operating rooms

at RUH. A week later, an anonymous donor stepped forward with a matching \$425,000 donation! An extraordinary start to a critically important campaign. The need to secure and integrate new technology, equipment, and pre- and post-operative space is crucial now due to the huge surgical backlog caused by the pandemic. On behalf of the Royal University Hospital Foundation Board of Directors and staff, thank you for ensuring RUH is ready for any challenge – even a global pandemic!



Facing the Pandemic Together: A Heartfelt Thank You

"We're all in this together" became the motto of 2020 around the world and in every area of our life. It was no different for Royal University Hospital. Royal University Hospital (RUH) Foundation collaborated with our sister foundations from Saskatoon City Hospital, St. Paul's Hospital and Jim Pattison Children's Hospital to create the COVID-19 Hospital Fund to accept support from generous donors who wanted to help address the urgent needs of frontline and support workers and patients. RUH Foundation was invited to join The Frontline Fund, a national hospital foundation partnership to receive donations from pan Canadian corporations, diverse businesses, family foundations and many individuals. Thanks to your generous support of the COVID-19 Hospital Fund, RUH Foundation has raised \$298,132 at March 31. Over \$500,000 was raised collectively.

Heartfelt support shown to our healthcare workers and in-hospital patients came in many forms. People came out on their front steps or balconies in April to bang pots, wave and make music to shine a light on the efforts of our medical and support teams. Businesses and individuals provided cash and in-kind donations. Affinity Credit Union made a \$20,000 gift. Others guickly followed, such as Westcap Management Ltd. with a \$250,000 donation to purchase 330 tablets to allow hospital patients across the province to stay connected with families and friends at a time when family and visitors weren't allowed in the hospital. For the owners and staff of the local M&M Food Market, it was important to show support to the people that help keep the hospitals safe and clean and so they provided RUH's 250

housekeeping staff with \$25 gift cards to enjoy a meal with their families.

Janna Dutton, a local Tim Hortons owner, donated 2,250 free coffee cards for frontline workers at RUH. Saskatchewan Blue Cross made wearing masks all day more comfortable by providing custommade ear savers for all employees across the province. Muskeg Media and National Brand Communications helped spread the word about the COVID-19 Hospital Fund through donated billboards.

Indeed, the COVID-19 Hospital Fund donations were put to good use immediately based on requests made by hospital staff and their departments to address urgent needs for patients or staff morale. Telephone cards were provided for patients being released from the Dubé Centre to stay connected to their out-patient programs by phone. For the month of May, the usual user-pay service for televisions in every patient room was covered by the COVID-19 Hospital Fund allowing patients to access the internet and

connect with family and friends using services like Skype or FaceTime. Donors helped purchase priority equipment such as the QUANTA-Lyser 3000 instrument, which provides optimal quality testing and allows laboratory staff to process a high volume of samples in less time, ultimately serving more patients faster. This particular equipment is an asset in dealing with the pandemic, and it will also benefit patients with immunological and autoimmune diseases in the longterm.

Truly, 2020 was a year when we honoured our frontline workers in hospitals and in many other organizations that serve the public every day. In the spirit of the COVID-19 Hospital Fund, the Royal University Hospital Foundation team joins everyone in the community in thanking our medical and support teams for their hard work, their dedication and their continued care during these challenging times. And we also thank the many donors who have and continue to contribute to help staff and patients. We are indeed facing this pandemic together.

New Dedicated Epilepsy Monitoring Unit Will Soon be a Reality

For over 10,000 individuals across Saskatchewan suffering from epilepsy, it is welcome news to know that the space is identified and final blueprints have been approved for a dedicated fourbed Epilepsy Monitoring Unit (EMU) at Royal University Hospital (RUH). Construction is planned for 2021–2022.



Epilepsy, a neurological disorder manifested by abnormal electrical activity in the brain, can be debilitating and life-threatening for some patients due to severe headaches, seizures, loss of consciousness and other unpredictable symptoms. Although some patients' epilepsy can be managed through medication, there are many for whom the only option may be specialized brain surgery, but first they need an in-hospital assessment.

Over 500 patients are referred to be assessed through the provincial Saskatchewan Epilepsy Program at RUH every year. Unfortunately, there are only two beds dedicated to the observation and monitoring of epilepsy patients to assess whether brain surgery might be a treatment, which means long wait times of up to two years. If all goes as planned, by year-end there will be a new four-bed dedicated EMU on the sixth floor Neurology Unit at RUH.

The new EMU will be equipped with the latest EEG Telemetry and video equipment to observe epilepsy patients. In addition, to keep patients safe and prevent secondary injury during a seizure, the dedicated EMU will be furnished with soft-surfaced bed railings, rounded furniture, padded flooring, and washroom facilities.

Thanks to the unwavering dedication of the late Dr. José Téllez-Zenteno, his team and the advocacy of hundreds of patients and their families, the EMU became a priority. Thanks to the generosity of donors, \$1.25 million was raised by RUH Foundation with \$1.35 million in annual operational funding committed from the provincial government. "Unfortunately, Dr. Téllez-Zenteno passed away before he could see the new EMU, but it was his passion and advocacy that made the soon-to-be built EMU a reality. We are grateful for his dedication to his patients, his passion for research, his willingness to step forward to speak to the importance of improved programs for people living with epilepsy, and for the many years of mentorship he provided to his team," says Arla Gustafson, CEO of RUH Foundation.

Through the campaign in support of the new EMU, Saskatchewan people realized how many individuals are affected by epilepsy. People like the late Myrna Knight from Regina who bequeathed a large donation through her estate in support of the Epilepsy Program.

"When her nieces were diagnosed with epilepsy, Myrna realized the struggles and hardships they had in dealing with the diagnosis. She wanted not only to help her family, but anyone going through this," says Myrna's sister Gloria.

Since 1988, Vetha Paine made the Saskatchewan Epilepsy Program her priority and gave a gift of \$30,401 prior to her passing in April while requesting that donations in her memory be made to RUH Foundation.

"We can't thank the people of Saskatchewan enough. Having a provincial dedicated Epilepsy Monitoring Unit at RUH will improve access, reduce wait times and allow people living with epilepsy to know faster if surgery is an option for them. We couldn't do this without the Saskatchewan Epilepsy Program's team's commitment and without Saskatchewan people's generosity," concludes Arla Gustafson.

Fellowship Program Continues to Support Specialist Training

Over the past two decades, Royal University Hospital (RUH) Foundation has invested \$1.67 million in donor support to advance specialist care for patients at RUH through Fellowships for forty-eight specialists for their subspecialty training!

Saskatchewan Health Authority's Fellowship Program provides the opportunity to physicians to pursue a sub-specialty after their residency. The road to a Fellowship is long. After four years of medical school, graduates are called "Doctor," but they are not done yet. They then start their two- to five-year Residency training as family doctors or in a specialty area such as anesthesia, emergency medicine, neurology, or cardiology to name only a few. After the completion of their Residency, some pursue sub-specializations – that is the Fellowship. Upon completion of their Fellowship, funded Fellows commit to return to RUH for at least a predetermined period to treat patients and share their newly acquired skills with colleagues.

Although some Fellowship training can take place in Saskatchewan, many Fellows who are accepted for a subspecialty have to uproot their family and move to another city in Canada or the USA. Such has been the case this past year for Dr. Jayden Cowan, a 2020–2021 Fellow in the sub-specialty of thoracic anesthesiology. Thanks to funding from the Legacy Fund for Trauma Care and the Robert A. Steane Trauma Fellowship, Dr. Cowan has been at the University of Calgary Foothills Medical Centre since September 2020 and is slated to return to RUH this August.

"It is incredibly humbling to receive

financial support through RUH
Foundation's Legacy Fund for Trauma
Care. This has enabled me to further subspecialize my anesthesia expertise. I am
proud to have grown up in Saskatchewan
and was fortunate enough to complete
my undergraduate, medical and
postgraduate anesthesiology training
through the University of Saskatchewan.
And I look forward to returning to fulltime practice in Saskatoon this summer,"
states Dr. Cowan.

As a thoracic anesthesiologist, Dr. Cowan will provide anesthetic care to patients with injuries to and diseases inside the chest. This care allows surgeons to repair the windpipe, lungs and structures in between the lungs. These procedures require specialized techniques and equipment to safely breathe for the patient while also creating space within the chest to allow the surgeon to operate. Thoracic anesthesiologists like Dr. Cowan are also trained in various pain-relieving procedures that enhance patient recovery and comfort while in hospital.

"Nearly four hundred planned thoracic surgeries occur in Saskatoon each year, not including patients suffering from traumatic injuries to their chest. I am honored to help provide these services to the people of Saskatchewan and to expand thoracic anesthesia education to resident physicians specializing in anesthesiology," says Dr. Cowan.

For the Department of Anesthesiology, Perioperative Medicine and Pain Management, it is important to be able to retain bright young specialists like Dr. Cowan. "Our Department is deeply grateful to RUH Foundation for the assistance in recruiting Dr. Jayden Cowan in the form of his Fellowship funding. Dr. Cowan's expertise in thoracic anesthesiology will be invaluable in leading our Department in delivering high quality patient care and research in this field," states Dr. Kevin Laskowski, Saskatoon Area Lead for the Department.

From 2019 until present, RUH Foundation has received over \$3 million from the Estate of Robert (Bob) Steane in support of the Legacy Fund for Trauma Care which includes provisions to support Fellowships, such as Dr. Cowan's, for the next 10 years. The Legacy Fund was established in 2018 in honour of the Humboldt Broncos, lives lost and changed forever, to build on and enhance RUH's Trauma Program. Arla Gustafson, CEO of RUH Foundation, highlights that Fellowships are made possible by Saskatchewan's people; "This is the 18th year that RUH Foundation has been able to fund Fellowship training thanks to the generosity of donors such as Bob Steane and countless others. It is wonderful to be able to support the advanced training of our local physicians, filling potential gaps in services and helping ensure that Saskatchewan patients can receive the best specialty care possible right here in our province."

Mission Possible: Operation New O.R. Campaign Underway

"I spent five long days on bed rest, waiting for an operating room to open up. I was filled with anxiety waiting for the surgery that would determine if I would ever walk again," says Karsten Felske who was rushed to Royal University Hospital (RUH) in November 2019, after a car accident on icy winter roads outside of Prince Albert. Like Karsten, many patients have to wait for surgery due to a backlog in cases and only a few operating rooms (O.R.) can be used for this type of complex surgery.

"I had no doubt Karsten would walk again. We have the highest caliber of surgeons, nurses and medical teams who work together in the O.R., but we are limited by the lack of space and infrastructure needed for the newest technology and equipment," says Dr. Daryl R. Fourney, Karsten's surgeon and Director of Research for the Department of Surgery.

The O.R.s at RUH - Saskatchewan's busiest hospital – are outdated and too small. Although the existing 43-yearold operating rooms at RUH benefited from new flooring and lighting ten years ago, they are due for a complete transformation. In December 2019, RUH Foundation's Board approved the Saskatchewan Health Authority's request to fundraise to improve surgical services including the O.R.s at RUH. On January 28, 2021 at the annual Radiothon, RUH Foundation launched the Mission Possible: Operation New O.R. Campaign, to raise \$20 million to build and equip new state-of-the-art operating rooms and pre- and post-operative recovery rooms. The mission is to reduce wait times, improve patient outcomes and

help retain and recruit surgical and medical teams to RUH.

The vision for the new O.R.s includes new lighting, HVAC, audiovisual, and specialized equipment. New fully integrated O.R.s will allow seamless communication and offer the latest technology mounted on booms so surgical teams have more floor space to move and perform procedures safely.

and a new echo cardiograph ultrasound system to name a few items.

Karsten Felske says, "The surgery went well and fortunately on day three post-surgery, I was able to stand. After 15 days in hospital, I was able to walk out and go home to my wife and daughter. My wife, Jen, and I are so incredibly grateful for the care and support we received at RUH."



New robotics will provide surgeons even greater accuracy, flexibility and control as they operate. Finally, the new O.R.s will be complete with new recovery and waiting spaces to enhance the privacy and comfort of patients and their families prior to and post-surgery. "Modern technologies and more space will allow medical procedures to be conducted right here at home, safely, with shorter wait times and quicker recovery," states Dr Fourney.

Thanks to donor support over the past year, new surgical equipment totalling \$1.25 million has already been ordered for our O.R.s including three new surgical beds, an OSI spine table and head positioner, new anesthesia machines and monitors, a mini CT Fluoroscopic Arm,

Karsten's story is one of 10,000 adult surgeries performed at RUH in any "normal" year. On average, Canadians go through three surgeries in their lifetime. That means any one of us or our family members will need surgery at some point. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, many surgeries have been pushed back. With the Mission Possible: Operation New O.R. Campaign underway and with Saskatchewan people's continued support to help raise the \$20 million needed, Royal University Hospital will be closer to being able to begin construction allowing RUH's surgical teams to address the backlog and deliver the best possible care in Saskatchewan's newest O.R.s.



ENDOWMENTS & FUNDS FOR RUH

Endowments give back year after year — an investment in the health of future generations. The principal sum remains untouched, while the distributable earnings are used to support a priorities at Royal University Hospital. Funds are held and disbursed according to the terms set out in the donor agreement. RUH Foundation manages a range of endowments and funds valued at \$18.21 million.

Nahid Baltzan Ahmad and Dr. Marc Baltzan Endowment – cardiology and kidney research.

Cameco Chair in Indigenous Health and Wellness Fund – awarded to a physician in Indigenous Health at the University of Saskatchewan's College of Medicine and Saskatchewan Health Authority's Royal University Hospital.

Canada Life Scholarship Endowment – scholarships for the education and training of

scholarships for the education and training of medical personnel, other than physicians, who work with patients.

Community Mental Health

Endowment – innovative initiatives that improve the mental health of individuals and/ or raise awareness of mental health and addictions. These initiatives include research; education; programs for patients and their families while in hospital; patient support programs in the community; and equipment for patient care. The following seven funds are named funds within the Community Mental Health Endowment:

The Ken Arnold Addictions Fund – mental health and addictions programming.

This past year, COIVD-19 changed many things within health care and our community. However as an Imagine Canada Accredited Charity, one of the constants is our Board of Directors'

and staff's commitment to ethical. transparent and effective fundraising. Thanks to the generosity of donors and supporters to our Mission Possible: Operation New O.R. Campaign; to the Covid-19 Hospital Fund; to events and lotteries; and increased investment earnings, more than \$11.3 million was raised. \$1.25 million was granted to establish a dedicated Epilepsy Monitoring Unit. Our Signature Grants and Donor Designated Grants to the Saskatchewan Health Authority and University of Saskatchewan allowed an investment of \$1.1 million in research, patient care and staff morale grants, Fellowships, and continuing education. As well, \$1.25 million will purchase critical O.R. equipment for our surgical

and O.R. teams for enhanced surgical care of patients at RUH.
