

What Will Your Planned Giving Legacy Be?

Planned giving is a way to be remembered for your generosity or a way to remember a loved one.

Listing Royal University Hospital Foundation (RUH Foundation) in your will ensures that your legacy of generosity is supporting healthcare priorities for Saskatchewan's patients and families who will need life-saving care and treatment at Royal University Hospital in the future.

How to Leave a Planned Gift

A charitable will bequest is direction in your will that instructs your Executor(s)/Trustee(s) to leave a portion of your assets to a charitable organization like the RUH Foundation. Below are a few options on how to leave a planned gift:

- A residual gift is the money that's 'left over' in an estate after all the fixed commitments are met
- A percentage gift is a percentage of your estate and the amount of this gift will ultimately vary depending on the estate size. For example, a donor to RUH Foundation who had 3 children divided her estate into 4 equal portions: each child received their portion of the estate, and the final portion will go to RUH Foundation.
- A fixed sum gift is when you name a specific dollar amount.

If the Foundation is unable to apply all or part of these funds for the specific purpose(s) stated above, then it may be applied by the Foundation as its directors see fit."

We know that considering a gift in your will is an emotional experience. Many people find this a most satisfying way of giving because they recognize that their gift can continue to make a difference.
